USING KNOWLEDGE ACROSS EUROPE

Within the Walter-Hallstein-Programme as part of the *Baden-Württemberg-STIPENDIUM*, the foundation Baden-Württemberg Stiftung supports Europe-wide exchange and intra-European cooperation at the administrative level.

The programme is aimed at two target groups:

1. University students and young professionals
2. Administrative institutions in Baden-Württemberg

All projects should focus on future-related topics such as digitisation, demographic change and sustainable mobility, which are dealt with jointly through the Europe-wide exchange of knowledge – in accordance with the spirit of the German politician Walter Hallstein. He gave his name to the programme and was the first President of the European Economic Community.



STUDENTS AND YOUNG PROFESSIONALS

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

- ▶ Advanced students of Europe-related studies in Baden-Württemberg
- ▶ Advanced students of Europe-related studies from other European countries
- ▶ Young professionals from administrative institutions in European countries



WHAT DO WE FUND?

Internships in an administration in Baden-Württemberg or in an administrative institution in other European countries

THAT'S HOW WE SUPPORT YOU

Scholarship value

- ▶ around 1,000 euros per month (purchasing power adjustment) to cover travel and maintenance costs

Scholarship duration

- ▶ 2 to 11 months

ADMINISTRATIVE INSTITUTIONS

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Municipalities, rural districts, cities and other public administrative institutions in Baden-Württemberg

WHICH TYPES OF PROJECTS ARE ELIGIBLE?

Joint projects between administrations from Baden-Württemberg and other European countries with the purpose to establish and expand networks and partnerships

THAT'S HOW WE SUPPORT YOU

Project volume

- ▶ from 5,000 euro to a maximum of 20,000 euro per year

Duration of project financing

- ▶ 1 to 2 years
